Greeting

Rev. Roger Zepernick called the meeting to order at 5:35pm.

Minutes

Statement of Financial Interest

The Statement of Financial Interests forms were distributed to all board members for completion. The forms are due for filing on May 1, 2019.

Monthly Financial Report

The Finance Committee met on February 26, 2019 and discussed the budget vs. actual for the December 2018 monthly report. Variances were reviewed. The school is still projecting a year end surplus. The 2019-20 school budget was discussed with a draft budget being presented at the April Board meeting. An update was provided concerning the redirection hearings.

Mid-Year Report

Mr. David Rossi informed that no instruction report will be provided today but the mid-year report is being presented in its place.

Ms. Lori Walinsky reported that health sciences, film and dance are the most popular majors. A total of 338 students are taking one or more honors courses representing 45.5% of the population.

The passing rate is presented at 81.8% at the high school and 95.3% at the middle school. This reflects a slight decrease in the high school and an increase in the middle school.

At the high school level, there was a slight increase in student failure when compared to last year, 4.1%. At the middle school the failure rate has decreased by 11.2%.

Mr. David Rossi reported on the increased elementary school reading level. A total of 44% of students are reading at or above grade level. Administration is discussing additional interventions for students who are not reading at targeted level.

The total special education population is 17% and the ELD population is at 25.3%.

College and Career Report

Ms. Rebecca DiSalvo reported that as of February 1st 91% of seniors have applied to at least three colleges or universities. Of those who have applied, 16.5% of the applications have been accepted and 82.7% are still pending on approval or denial status.

About 8 students have received financial reward offers based on merit. Award values ranged from \$3,500-\$25,000 for year one and \$14,000-\$276,000 if renewed over a 4-year period.

Highlights from the College and Career Report are:

-Valedictorian has been accepted into the University of Pennsylvania

-3 students have been accepted to the Comprehensive Studies Program at the Pennsylvania State University.

-3 instant decision days leading to over 50 acceptances to 3 college and universities

-Senior seminar class offered for the first time leading to an increase in the number of applications and increase in the number of students who have completed FAFSA

-One student was accepted to Williamson College of the Trades with full-tuition/room and board scholarship

A discussion was had on what options students are getting when college is not a fit. Administration clarified that students are able to apply to college/universities or trade/vocational schools.

School Progress Report

Mr. David Rossi reported on what the School District of Philadelphia measures all district and charter schools using the School Performance Report (SPR) metric. The middles school ranked 6th of the 33 middle schools in Philadelphia, 3rd of 13 charter middle schools and if compared to Special Admission middle schools, EA middle school ranked 4th of 7 meaning achieved higher score than some middle schools have admission requirements.

The High School in addition to being honored for 3 years of consecutive growth on the SPR metric ranked 18th of 83 high school in Philadelphia. Amongst charter schools' city wide EA ranked 6th out of 31. When compared to high schools with admission requirements EA ranked 12th out of 29, outperforming 16 district High Schools with admission requirements.

There are four domains that are measures and they are: performance on standardized assessment, including keystone exams (algebra I, Biology, Literature), Access for ELL, PSSA and reading assessments, student attendance, retention rate, suspension rate, parent survey, college and career matriculation rate, AP, IB & NOCTI exams participation, SAT & ACT exams, FAFSA, student survey.

The Board and administration discussed the role of parents at the school.

CEO Report

Mr. David Rossi has reported that a draft of the renewal report is expected in Spring 2019. Request for a guaranteed 800 elementary students is included in the renewal application. A close out report was received

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A hearing was scheduled for January 10-11 but the School District of Philadelphia withdrew its objection to the redirection funds. We revised our request for an additional \$1,743,000 that was rejected in 2016-17.

Any Board member seated after June 30, 2018 are required to attend a training. One of the options is in Philadelphia at Excellent School PA. Any Board member can attend the training and online options are available.

On March 7th, teachers from 24 countries representing 6 continents will be at the Academy for a Teacher Exchange Program hosted by Temple University.

A letter was sent home regarding threats made against the school via social media. The police was contacted and an investigation is presently being conducted. Communication was made to parents via phone blast, email, website and a letter. A conversation was held regarding the use of Social Sentinel, a security alert system.

Act 44 is required for all public schools which provides guidance for schools in PA concerning various school security issues. Unfortunately, charter schools are not included in the competitive grant.

Gov. Wolf's State Budget is proposing a teacher minimum salary of \$45,000. This would not apply to charter school as they are exempt. This has not yet been passed but if passed every school district in Pennsylvania will receive funding to help bring up minimum salary or support the salary.

Discipline Report

The high school had a total of 23 out of school suspensions and the middle school had 40 out of school suspensions.

Enrollment Report

As of February 12, 2019, there was a total of 1577 enrolled. There were 40 students who withdrew as of the last Board meeting and 44 students were brought in.

Other

Rev. Roger Zepernick has informed that he and Mr. Angel Ortiz met with the Executive Committee of Esperanza to discuss relationship and possibility of having a joint meeting. Also discussed during the meeting was understanding roles and responsibilities.

Mr. Brandon Fuller has submitted his letter of resignation. Unfortunately, due to the distance and his job he has had to resign. The Board has expressed its gratitude for serving the school for these years.
